

## **COMMERCIAL TRASH & RECYCLING GUIDELINES**

- \* Recycling of aluminum, glass, plastic, paper and cardboard is mandatory in Mountain Village.
- \* HOAs must have adequately-sized trash/recycling enclosures to accommodate all tenants.
- \* All trash enclosures must be hidden from public view and kept clean and orderly at all times.
- \* All trash enclosures must be closed and latched at all times to prevent wildlife from entering.
- \* All trash and recycling containers inside the enclosure must be bear-proof.
- \* Enclosures must have adequately-sized containers for trash and recycling, to prevent overflow.
- \* Hazardous materials may not be stored inside the trash enclosures and must be disposed of properly, including fluorescent lights, batteries, paints, oils.
- \* Construction waste must not be disposed of in trash containers.
- Restaurant grease and fryer oils cannot be thrown in trash and must be disposed of properly and in a timely manner.

## **RECYCLING STEPS**

- ✓ Empty and rinse containers.
- ✓ Remove caps and lids.
- ✓ Remove labels from bottles and cans, if possible.
- ✓ Remove non-recyclable packing materials, such as peanuts and foam.
- ✓ Flatten boxes.
- $\checkmark$  Keep paper and cardboard together and to the side of the commingled items.

The Town of Mountain Village requires all commercial properties to recycle according to the above guidelines.

## **RECYCLABLE & NON-RECYCLABLE MATERIALS**

ALUMINUM, TIN & STEEL	aluminum/tin cans, metal lids and bottle tops	aluminum foil aluminum trays
GLASS	colored and clear glass bottles and jars	mirrors, vases, ceramics or windows glassware or kitchen plates ceramics
PLASTICS	recyclable plastics labeled #1 – #7	plastic wrap, plastic bags, plastic caps or lids recyclable coffee lids plastic packaging without a recycling symbol Styrofoam
PAPER & Cardboard	newspapers, advertisements, magazines, phone books, envelopes, brochures/pamphlets, file folders, card stock egg cartons shredded paper — placed in paper bag cardboard pizza boxes (take food out) paper towel and toilet paper rolls	cartons with waxy coating (ice cream, milk, juice) paper coffee cups compostable cups, plates, and utensils paper towels construction paper photographs
OTHER ITEMS	coat hangers wire	ice cube trays corks batteries and electronic waste (e-waste) fabric appliances dog food and dog waste bags
